# Why Vote?

lowa law dictates that gaming activities may occur only in counties where the majority of citizens approve the "proposition" in a county-wide vote. Greene County held its initial vote in August 2013, which passed with a record 75.1% approval. Authorization lasts for 8 years. If the county-wide measure is approved in two successive referendums, no further votes are necessary.

# Here's how

#### **REGISTER**

**By Oct. 18**<sup>th</sup> with Greene County Auditor. Register in person, on line, by mail or on election day with proper ID.

## **REQUEST**

**Absentee Ballot from County Auditor.** Request an absentee ballot in person, on line or by mail. These are being accepted **NOW** at the Auditor's office, 114 N. Chestnut.

### RECEIVE & RETURN

Your Absentee Ballot will arrive in the mail about 20 days before the election. Fill out and return the absentee ballot by mail or in-person to the Auditor's Office. Your ballot MUST BE RECEIVED in the Greene County Auditor's office by Election Day, Nov. 2.

## IN PERSON EARLY VOTING

Oct. 13-Nov. 1 with Greene County Auditor.

Avoid the mail and vote absentee in person during the 20 days prior to an election.
